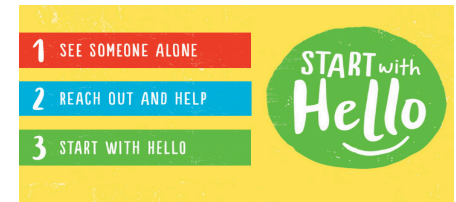






Start with Hello Week! September 16-20, 2024

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| MEET-N-GREET MONDAY <small>Use your own personalized "Hello Style" to encourage connection and discussions. Connect with someone new or someone you may not normally chat with.</small> <u>Listen to Hello Song GoNoodle</u> <u>Hello Song Songs For Kids Dance Along GoNoodle</u> SEL/Morning Meeting Discussion about Conversation Skills. <u>View/discuss video:</u> <u>Social Skills Video - Having a Conversation</u> <u>Start With Hello Lunch Talk Cards</u> Help students practice initiating and sustaining conversations by using Start With Hello Lunch Talk Cards. Students can be given a few of the prompts to use at lunch. Trusted Adult Tip: Build rapport with students by joining into the fun! Choose a different table every day to answer the Start With Hello Lunch Talk question, and listen to the student's answers! | UPSTANDER TUESDAY <small>Create an environment in which students are encouraged and empowered to do simple, everyday prosocial actions that include others! Recognize Upstanders who are thoughtful and take action to build a safer, more inclusive community.</small> Show appreciation to Upstanders in your class. Recognize students who reach-out and help others, make others feel seen, invite classmates to join in activities, and work to be inclusive. *Celebrate students in class who are upstanders in your class with 'An Upstander Spotlight Showcase'  <u>Upstander Ribbon</u> Take a moment during the day to shine the "spotlight" on students who are Upstanders. Staff - Recognize a colleague for their upstanding behavior in this week's Shout Outs in News at the Nest. | GREEN WEDNESDAY <small>It's "Green Wednesday". Focus on green today as a symbol of unity, inclusivity, and solidarity.</small> Green serves as a symbol of unity, inclusivity, and solidarity with Sandy Hook Promise and shows support of Start with Hello Week's mission to reduce social isolation and boost empathy and belonging. Together, engage in a Mindful Moment. Take a look around the room, name all the green items/things you see. *As a class, share what the color green symbolizes to them. Lead a Mindful Minute exercise before engaging in a class activity <u>Mindful Minutes PreK - 5th grade</u> Take 49 seconds to engage in this breathing activity together - <u>Calm Breathe Bubble</u> with students. | TRUSTED ADULT THURSDAY <small>Celebrate, recognize, and connect to Trusted Adults! Give gratitude and Thank a Trusted Adult in the school.</small> *Students reach out and thank a trusted adult for helping and supporting them. Students may write a note to give to a trusted adult.
