**PowerSchool:** Students and parents have access to PowerSchool to check students' grades and attendance. Parents can stay up to date on grades through PowerSchool. Parents can request access to PowerSchool by calling the front office.

### <u>Attendance</u>

#### ABSENCES

Great student attendance goes hand-in-hand with great academics; attending school is critical to your child's success. To be considered for an excused absence, within 3 days of your return from an absence, bring a note for the homeroom teacher stating the following: your name, date, days of absence, reason for absence, and parent/guardian signature. Students accumulating **more than 12 absences** during the school year will be referred to the retention/promotion committee to make a determination regarding promotion or retention.

<u>Make-up work</u>- Students will have 3 days to make arrangements regarding their assignments when returning from an absence. Work scheduled prior to absences is due the day the student returns. Any absence believed to be an educational opportunity must be approved <u>in advance</u> by the principal.

### ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL

Students may begin entering the school at 8:00. Students are able to eat breakfast until 8:15 am. Students will grab breakfast and take it directly to class.

Tardy Bell = 8:30 am. Students are <u>late to class</u> if they are not in the classroom when class begins. Always aim to be at school 10-15 minutes early for traffic. Students who accumulate excessive unexcused tardies and/or are excessively late to class are subject to disciplinary consequences.

Early check-out ends at <u>**2:45 pm**</u>. Parent photo identification is required for early checkout.

### <u>SAFETY</u>

All students are subject to metal detection/searches each day. To assist with this process, all students will be **required to carry clear backpacks** this school year. Athletic bags and band instruments will be placed in a secure location upon entry to school.

### <u>Cafeteria</u>

The School Nutrition Program operated by Gaston County Schools will provide ALL students enrolled at Southwest Middle School free breakfast and lunch for the 2024-2025 school year.

#### **Buses**

Bus transportation is provided to middle school students living at least a mile from SWMS. Student safety is a primary concern in all bus procedures. Riding the bus is a privilege not a right. All district and school rules are in effect on the school bus. These are provided for students at enrollment in their beginning of the year paperwork and can be found in the Gaston County Schools Student Information Guide. Students will lose bus privileges if their conduct endangers others or distracts the driver. Bus stop information can be received by calling the front office.

During the school year, students will participate in several assessments required by the N.C. Department of Public Instruction and Gaston County Schools. Dates of testing will be shared through a ParentLink message and on our school Facebook page.

# DRESS CODE

**As stated in the Gaston County Schools Code of Conduct:** The appearance of any young person is primarily the responsibility of that individual and his/her parents. Each student is expected to maintain an appearance that is neither distracting to other students nor disruptive to the educational environment or the safe and healthy climate of schools.

# Students shall <u>not</u> wear:

Bandannas, hair picks, combs, wide headbands, head scarves, sunglasses in the buildings, masks, distracting wigs, clothing that displays sexually explicit words/drawings, profanity, alcohol, drugs, or gang symbols, clothing that exposes undergarments, clothing with large rips or tears that expose skin from the upper chest to mid-thigh, low cut tops that expose student's cleavage, pajamas, or bedroom shoes. Leggings are not the same as pants or shorts. Therefore, students who wear leggings must wear a shirt that covers all of their backside. **Blankets** are not permitted to be carried around during the school day. **Only clear water bottles may be carried** – No Yetis, Stanley Cups, etc..

Students who choose not to follow the dress code will be allowed to call home for appropriate clothing. Students will be assigned to the Redirect Room until appropriate clothing is brought to school.

# STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

- Be a resident/GCS approved transfer student for SWMS AND cannot be 15 years old <u>on or before</u> October 16 of the current school year.
- A student must pass all but one of their courses in the previous semester. 6th graders are automatically eligible during the fall semester of 6th grade. Students can have no more than 13 absences in a semester.
- All athletes are required to have a NCHSAA physical form completed by a doctor before they can try out or participate in any capacity. A physical is good for 395 days. All physicals must be on the NCHSAA form, which can be obtained on the GCS website or from the front office.
